Chinese scientists complete genome sequencing for coconut

[China Daily, 02.11.2017] -- On November 2, 2017, scientists from the Chinese Academy of Tropical Agricultural Sciences announced that they had accomplished sequencing the genome of the coconut. At the same time, the research article was published in Giga Science journal. The achievement lays solid foundations for further research of functional genes of the coconut and Palmae family.

Technology realizes agricultural sustainable development in NE China

[China Daily, 06.11.2017] -- In the past dozens of years, the amount of productive land in the black soil region in NE China has decreased and its quality has been lowered because of the predatory farming. Therefore, straw-overlaying (mulching) technology is adopted by local people in order to regain the fertile black topsoil and maximize the natural cycle between straw and soil in farmlands. As a result, topsoil deterioration in NE China has been reduced.

From lab to farmland, technology revolutionizes agriculture in China

Through this technology, the natural environment of plants, such as temperature, humidity and light intensity, can be monitored by a control terminal.

Four Chinese sites selected as global agricultural heritages

[CSNC, 26.11.2017] -- On November 24, 2017, a meeting of the Scientific Advisory Group on Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems (GIAHS) was convened by the FAO in Rome. During the meeting, the Zhagana Farming, Forestry and Animal Husbandry Compound System in Gansu Province and the Huzhou Mulberry Dyke Fishpond System in Zhejiang Province were formally designated as GIAHS sites. At the same time, the four rice terrace areas in south and east China and the Xiajin Ancient Mulberry Wood in Shandong Province were approved in principle.

New pepper species discovered in S China

[China Daily, 22.12.2017] -- In accordance with the Chinese Academy of Tropical Agricultural Sciences, scientists discovered a new pepper species in South China's Hainan Province. *Piper jianfenglingense*, the new species, is found in evergreen broad leaf forests at elevations between 500 and 800 meters at the Jianfengling National Nature Reserve in the province's Ledong Li autonomous county.

Scientists close in on origin of SARS

[China Daily, 07.12.2017] – Some Chinese scientists think that the origin of the deadly SARS virus may have found by them in a remote cave in Yunnan Province, where they identified a single population of horseshoe bats that harbor virus strains with all the genetic building blocks. According to research published in PLoS Pathogens on November 30, 2017, the strain could easily have arisen from such bats.

Chinese foresters win UN award

[Xinhua, 06.12.2017] – On December 5, 2017, forest rangers in northern China's Saihanba Forest Farm received the UN Champions of the Earth Award for their outstanding contribution to restoration of degraded landscapes. The forest in Saihanba is an important ecological shield for Beijing and Tianjin. It purifies 137 million cubic meters of water and delivers half a million tons of oxygen every year.

Cropping System Conversion led to Organic Carbon Change in China's Mollisols Regions

[Nature Scientific Reports, 22.12.2017] -- Driven by diet, globalization and technology development, land use changes have greatly influenced agricultural production and environment in the mollisols region of China. Through a ten-year research in Northeast China, scientists discovered that the decline rate of soil organic carbon (SOC) in recent ten years has decreased considerably compared to previous decades. The paper is jointly written by Yuxi Tong, Weifeng Zhang, Fusuo Zhang, et al., from the China Agricultural University (CAU) and the Heilongjiang Academy of Agriculture Sciences.

Earliest hydraulic enterprise in China, 5,100 years ago

[PNAS, 26.12.2017] – Originating from the Yangtze Delta, Liangzhu culture is considered as a peak of early cultural and social development predating the historically recorded Chinese dynasties. According to archaeological surveys and excavations, the extent and structure of dams, levees, ditches and other landscape-transforming features in Liangzhu covered an area of about 300 ha. The paper is jointly written by Bin Liu, Ningyuan Wang, Minghui Chen etc., from different Chinese and British research institutions.

Draft law gives gov't, polluters responsibilities on soil pollution control

[Xinhua, 22.12.2017] -- The draft law on prevention and control of soil pollution, which increases the responsibilities of government and polluters in controlling and correcting pollution, was submitted to the top legislature for its first reading in June. Chinese lawmakers began the second reading of it on Dec. 22, 2017. The draft made it clear that it was the local government's responsibility to conduct pollution risk evaluation and rehabilitation of land, if the land use right had been retrieved and the former owner was responsible for its pollution.

According to the document, China will expand a pilot reform to nationwide starting in 2018, obliging polluters to repair the environment or pay a compensation. In order to protect and improve the ecosystem in China, the government aims to establish an efficient comprehensive damage compensation system by 2020.

China earmarks 7.5 billion dollars for environment protection

[Xinhua, 24.11.2017] – According to You Yanxin, an official with the planning and finance department of the Ministry of Environmental Protection, China has set aside 49.7 billion yuan (about 7.5 billion U.S. dollars) for supporting environmental protection this year. So far, 39 billion yuan has been handed out for air, water and soil pollution control.

The project includes a pilot facility in the Hunter Valley of New South Wales state to make bioethanol from the agricultural waste.

[Reuters, 05.11.2017] -- The Chinese government implemented tough new pollution standards which would ban livestock production near water sources or heavily populated areas. At the same time, farms in other regions must meet higher standards for treating manure. In order to comply with the new standards, the pace of government inspections and shutdowns has increased. Some analysts think that the environmental inspections will have a significant long-term impact on meat supplies and prices.

He also highlighted that water conservancy infrastructure is key to supply-side structural reform in agriculture and the good of farmers and China must optimize the water conservancy network and step up disaster prevention and mitigation, despite the progress of the past five years.

Beijing air pollution notably reduced in winter

[Xinhua, 02.12.2017] -- In an environment forum which was held in Huizhou, Guangdong Province, Minister of Environmental Protection Li Ganjie told attendees that levels of $PM_{2.5}$ in Beijing dropped about 27 percent year-on-year in the March-November 2017 period. It demonstrated that the city is likely to meet its smog control target of the year. In order to fight air pollution, the government has taken a series of measures such as closing factories, limiting cars, replacing coal with clean energy and so on.

China pig herd shrinks further in October: agriculture ministry

[Reuters, 15.11.2017] -- Since the Chinese government implemented new environmental regulations, many efforts have been made by local governments to enforce the new tough standards by December 2017, and hundreds of thousands of mainly smaller pig farms have closed in recent months. Under those standards, livestock production is banned near water sources or major population areas. At the same time, farms in other areas must meet high standards on treatment of animal waste.

China to buy another 12 mln t of US soybeans in 2017/18 in \$5 bln deals

[Reuters, 09.11.2017] -- China is the world's top soybean buyer, and the United States is its second supplier. Recently, two letters of intent with Chinese importers have been signed by the United States soybean industry. The letters covered a \$5 billion purchase of an additional 12 million tonnes of soybeans in the 2017/18 marketing year. The agreements come as U.S. farmers seek to export more beans after growing a record crop.

COFCO sees China's soybean imports hitting 100 mln t in 17/18

[Reuters, 15.11.2017] -- On November 15, 2017, a senior executive at COFCO Corp. forecast that China will import 100 million tonnes of soybeans in 2017/18. The figure is above official U.S. and Chinese estimates for intake by the world's top importer of the oil seed. A deputy general manager of the oil seeds processing division for COFCO expected soybeans demand in 2018 in China to remain at a "high rate of growth".

Reform of Minimum Grain Purchase Prices: Policy Options

[China Daily, 08.11.2017] -- According to some experts, it is high time that the Chinese government should conduct reform of the minimum grain purchase. They suggest that efforts should be made to promote policy reform of minimum grain purchase prices by means of purchasing grain at minimum purchase prices in order to prevent grain prices from further dropping and separating pricing from subsidies. Future pricing will be only one price for rice instead of different prices set for different rice varieties.

Political advisors offer suggestions to China's grain pricing reform

[Xinhua, 16.11.2017] -- On November 16 2017, Yu Zhengsheng, chairman of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, hosted a bi-weekly consultation session in Beijing. During the session, China's political advisors discussed ways to reform the country's grain pricing system. They suggested that measures should be taken to improve ways to subsidize the grain growers in order to prevent a drop in their income.

China to expand rural land ownership reform

[China Daily, 01.12.2017] -- On December 1, 2017, a meeting was held in Tianchang, a major grain-producing region in Central China's Anhui province. At the meeting, Vice Agricultural Minister Ye Zhenqin said that a total of 300 counties would be covered in the pilot program of the rural land ownership reform, up from current 129. The reform was initiated in 2014 to grant farmers more rights to benefit from collective land in villages.

China uses less pesticide: official

[China Daily, 05.12.2017] -- Since the Chinese government started a campaign to ensure zero growth in pesticide use by 2020, China's pesticide use has dropped in the past three years. Zeng Yande, head of the crop production department of the Ministry of Agriculture, said that the ministry tightened market access and punished unlicensed companies. Besides the drop in pesticide use, China has also raised the efficiency of pesticide use and stepped up the use of biological pesticides.

China's grain output climbs in 2017

[China Daily, 08.12.2017] -- In accordance with the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS), China's grain output saw a mild increase in 2017, compared with last year. One statistician from the bureau said that it was the second highest output in history. Grain planting area shrank by 815,000 hectares, while the per unit yield was up by 54 kilograms per hectare, or 1 percent year on year. At the same time, many areas reduced corn planting in favor of soy and used some grain for feedstuff because of an oversupply of corn and rising demand for soy and other grain varieties.

China reduces corn planting area amid excessive stock

[China Daily, 18.12.2017] -- In accordance with the Chinese Ministry of Agriculture (MOA), the Chinese government plans to reduce corn planting area by 1.33 million hectares in 2017 because of excessive corn stock. The reductions mainly concentrate in areas with low and unsteady output, including the country's arid Northwest and desertified regions in the Southwest. While reducing corn output, China has been actively increasing the supply of crops that are in short supply, such as soybeans and potatoes.

World Bank approves \$150m loan for China's farm produce distribution system

[China Daily, 18.12.2017] -- According to a statement from the World Bank, although China's produce market experienced a rapid development, farm produce logistics remains a bottleneck to in the distribution system which hinders producers' potential for more efficient production and higher incomes. Therefore, the bank has approved a \$150-million loan to the southeastern Chinese province of Jiangxi to improve its farm produce distribution system. It will benefit over 200,000 farmers through more efficient farm-to-market supply chains.

Quarter of Chinese villages have e-commerce distribution sites

[Xinhua, 14.12.2017] -- According to data of the third national agricultural census in China, nearly a quarter of Chinese villages had e-commerce distribution sites by the end of 2016. China's agriculture census has been conducted every ten years since 1996 to collect information on rural production, infrastructure, public services and living conditions. The third census involved 5 million census takers, more than 200 million rural households and over 3 million businesses and market entities.


Census shows China moving towards scale farming
